

Vermont's Universal Recycling Law, Act 148, bans clean wood from being disposed of in the trash as of July 1, 2016. "Wood waste" means trees, untreated wood, and other natural woody debris, including tree stumps, brush and limbs, root mats, and logs. Please note, this refers to clean wood only, meaning that it has **not been treated** in any way be that by paint, varnish, glue, pressure treat etc.

- **If you bring clean wood material from your job to the Londonderry Transfer Station for disposal, you will no longer be allowed to dispose of it with your other construction debris.**
- **If you bring your construction debris in a dump trailer, consider loading the clean wood on last so it can be deposited in a place designated by the transfer station attendant.**
- **If clean wood is mixed in with other construction debris making it impossible to separate, you can be turned away from dumping your entire load.**
- **If you hire a hauler to dispose of your construction debris contact them to ask how they would like you to separate your clean wood from the rest of your construction debris.**
