

LONDONDERRY VERMONT PARKING ORDINANCE

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY. Under the authority granted in 24 V.S.A. Chapter 59, 24 V.S.A. § 2291(4), 23 V.S.A. § 1008 and 19 V.S.A. § 304 (a) (6), the Selectboard of the Town of Londonderry hereby adopts this civil ordinance regulating parking.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to promote safety, to provide good traffic flow and to assist the town in the maintenance of streets and highways.

SECTION 3. SEPARATE OFFENSES. Each violation of a provision of this ordinance shall be deemed a separate offense.

SECTION 4. WINTER PARKING. It shall be unlawful for vehicles to be parked within the public right-of-way of the town streets or highways, for any period of time, from November 1 until May 1.

SECTION 5. PARKING OTHER THAN WINTER MONTHS. It shall be unlawful for vehicles to be parked or left unattended within the public right of way of the town streets or highways for more than 24 hours. It shall be unlawful for vehicles to be parked within a travelled portion of a roadway at any time.

SECTION 6. ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES. Vehicles parked in violation of these regulations may be towed, at the expense of the owner, by order of the Road Foreman, Selectboard, or law enforcement officials who have jurisdiction in the town. In addition to towing and storage costs, a penalty of \$100.00 may be assessed for each violation.

SECTION 7. EXCEPTIONS TO SECTIONS 4 AND 5. Fire and rescue vehicles and Town road maintenance vehicles while performing necessary functions, and delivery vehicles making deliveries where other parking is unavailable, shall be relieved of the requirements of Sections 4 and 5 for the duration of time needed to perform their respective functions.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective 60 days after its adoption by the Selectboard. If a petition is filed under 24 V.S.A. § 1973, that statute shall govern the taking effect of this ordinance.

SECTION 9. REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES. The parking ordinance of 1979 is hereby repealed and replaced with this ordinance.

SECTION 10. SEVERABILITY. If any section of this ordinance is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such finding shall not invalidate any other part of this ordinance.
